
What Do You Need?

Unit 13 · Session 1
Elijah and the Widow

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- God sent a drought to punish King Ahab.
- Elijah, God's prophet, traveled to a widow who was starving.
- The widow's oil and flour did not run out, and God raised her son from the dead.
- God provided in miraculous ways.

KEY PASSAGE: Isaiah 42:8

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- Why do you think God provides in different ways at different times?
- What are some ways God has provided for us?
- How can we thank God for His provision?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

• Look up a recipe for bread and recruit your kids to help make and knead the bread. Then, use the bread as a focal point of a family dinner where you discuss the Bible story and God's goodness to your family.

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- Elijah asked God to send fire, and God burned up the entire altar.
- God showed that He is the one true God.

KEY PASSAGE: Isaiah 42:8

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.


FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- God chose Elisha to continue Elijah's work as a prophet

KEY PASSAGE: Isaiah 42:8

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.


FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:








What's Missing?

Unit 13 · Session 4 Elisha and the Army

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- The Aramean army was planning to attack God's people.
- Elisha warned the king of Israel, so the king of Aram wanted to capture Elisha.
- God protected Elisha with an invisible army.
- God blinded the Aramean army, and Elisha led them away from the city they wanted to attack.

KEY PASSAGE: Isajah 42:8

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- Why do you think God sent an invisible army instead of one the Arameans could see?
- How does God protect us today?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

• Take your family on an outing to a park on a windy day. Fly a kite and talk to your kids about the power and force of the wind despite our inability to see it. Remind your kids that God is all-powerful even though we cannot see Him.
